This bipartisan bill will help West Virginia by addressing the needs of our state while creating good-paying jobs and growing the economy over the next decade. West Virginia has 1,545 bridges and more than 3,200 miles of highway in poor condition, and 32 percent of trains and other transit vehicles in the state are past useful life. At least 258,000 West Virginians have no broadband access. This kind of investment hasn't been made in three decades.
